### JASON M. GARFIELD SCHOLARSHIP FUND UPDATE

Since the inception of the Jason M. Garfield Scholarship Fund in the Fall of 1983 we, thanks to donations from friends and relatives, have been able to award six four-year scholarships in the amount of \$1,000 per year per student. In addition to awarding scholarships we have been able to make substantial contributions to various charitable foundations, such as, The New England Children's Happiness Fund through which we have enabled several terminally ill children to take the vacation of their dreams.

Because the Jason M. Garfield Scholarship is very unique and special, the past and present recipients have demonstrated strong leadership qualities and distinctive personality traits. Our scholarship application process is thorough and personalized. The application form follows a special format, including recommendation letters from the student's parents and teachers, as well as a personal essay addressing why the applicant wants the scholarship.

Our board of six appointed directors then studies and grades each application form and student on an individual basis before choosing the new recipient.

The Jason M. Garfield Scholarship past and current recipients are an impressive and outstanding group of individuals. They include Michael Mastromatteo, who graduated from the University of Massachusetts majoring in pre-med, and is presently attending medical school in Galway, Ireland. This year, an additional financial award has been given to Mr. Mastromatteo in acknowledgement of his academic accomplishments.

The second recipient was Caroline Cummings who has been attending Eckerd College in Florida. Ms. Cummings will receive her degree in Business Management this coming May.

The third scholarship was awarded to Heather Strout, a recent graduate from Boston College's School of Management.

The 1989 recipient, William Rockett attended Hobart and William Smith Colleges and majored in journalism.

Julia Richardson, the 1990 recipient is a nursing major at the University of Delaware.

The 1991 Jason M. Garfield Scholarship has been awarded to Sharon Gosling. Ms. Gosling, a freshman at Springfield College, is majoring in physical therapy.

The Scholarship Fund's board of directors is very proud of these special individuals and is honored that they continue to keep in touch and enjoy sharing updates on their careers.

## MARBLEHEAD YOUTH HOCKEY AWARD
